GRAD STUDENT UNION FACTS

- STEM STUDENTS ARE NOT PAID MORE The truth is pay varies
 wildly both across the university and among departments. There
 are grade 14 engineering Ph.D. candidates (the second lowest pay
 grade), and grade 20+ graduate employees in English. We all
 deserve a living wage.
- YOUR PAY WON'T GO DOWN A union is a democratic organization of employees. They win benefits like pay raises through a <u>collective bargaining agreement</u>. That agreement or contract is voted on by all union members. We would not vote for a contract that lowers our wage.
- GET PAID FOR THE WORK YOU DO Most of us are on "half-time" appointments but are expected to work far more than 20 hours. A union will not restrict how much work you can do but will ensure you get paid for <u>all</u> the hours you work.
- A 3% RAISE IS A 5% PAY CUT WITH INFLATION Admin recently announced a 3% pay raise. With inflation, that amounts to a 5% cut. In contrast, the University of Michigan grad student union won an 11.4 % raise regardless of field of study.
- INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS CAN UNIONIZE Admin has
 previously indicated international students might put their visas in
 danger if they were to join a union. The fact is in the history of
 graduate student unions, not a single international student has
 had their visa impacted by unionizing activity. It is a legally
 protected right.
